- For your information, if you are having trouble receiving travel reimbursement for your visits to Newington or West Haven, there is a website that you can use to make sure all your visits are recorded and paid in a timely manner: https://eauth.va.gov/accessva/ Once in, choose Veteran Travel Claim Entry then choose a Login. From there you have to work through various screens to find the dates and times of your visits and you can claim them by hitting the appropriate buttons. The reimbursements seem to take approximately two weeks when done this way.
