

 On November 11, 2023 Corporal Henry Toberman Post No. 938 Veterans of Foreign Wars honored three living World War II veterans with Citations from the Connecticut General Assembly and an engraved World War II mediation. The ceremony was part of a three-town event that was held at the Willington Veterans Memorial in Willington Connecticut. Two of the citations were awarded by State Senator Jeff Gordon and the First Selectmen of Willington and Ashford. The Citation for the remaining Veteran was issued by Senator Gordon and the Mayor of Mansfield. Special engraved Medallions were presented to all three World War II Veterans by Edward DAgata Commander of Post 938 and Lt Col Alyssa Kelleher a two time Bronze Star recipient. A reception was held in the Main Hall of the Willington Senior Center at the close of the Veterans Day Ceremony.
